GIS

- We provided a hydrant map for a Planning and Development ISO audit.

- Sarah Bishop upgraded the SolarWinds database to the current version of SQL.
- We are working on integrating some of the databases that we use internally so that they can be combined for efficiency.
- We received a new storage server that is portable and may be taken offsite if needed.
- We have begun logistic planning for the Christmas light show.

Websites

- Online beach chair and umbrella rentals are showing a year over year slight sales decrease. After removing some of the high demand boxes from online sales 2018 on-line sales were \$257,445 versus \$262,860 for 2017.
- After finding that the app we were planning to use for Beach Services was too expensive, Rob and Sarah B. met with them to discuss alternatives. We are going to attempt to write an in-house version instead.
- According to "Stat Counter" NMB.US had 32,210 unique visitors in August versus 34,203 in July. PARKS.NMB.US had 23,496 unique visitors in August compared to 26,616 in July. Aquatics and Fitness had 6,467 unique visitors in August compared to 8,209 in July. Public Safety had 8,777 unique visitors in August compared to 7,907 in July. The Sports Park site had 65,707 unique visitors in August compared to 96,688 unique visitors in July.
