- We provided Johnson Controls (our HVAC contractor) with secure access to their monitoring software.

- According to "Stat Counter" NMB.US had 23,430 unique visitors in October versus 57,836 in September. PARKS.NMB.US had 15,573 unique visitors in October compared to 13,371 in September. Aquatics and Fitness had 5,245 unique visitors in October compared to 5,137 in September. Public Safety had 3,935 unique visitors in October compared to 6,174 in September. The Sports Park site had 29,339 unique visitors in October compared to 16,871 unique visitors in September.
- So far this year (11/26/18) the Sports Park has had 493,891 unique visitors compared to all of 2017 where we had 506,957 uniques.
