## GIS

- Sarah worked on upgrade solutions for ArcGIS Enterprise.

- As of August 14<sup>th</sup> chair and umbrella season pass and rental sales reached \$249,940. This exceeds same period last year sales of \$194,140.
- During July Rob and Sarah began working within Microsoft's Azure Cloud. We are accessing the possibility that we can port some of our current programs over and take advantage of its stability.
- According to "Stat Counter" NMB.US had 37,956 unique visitors in July versus 36,636 in June. PARKS.NMB.US had 25,887 unique visitors in July compared to 23,137 in June. Aquatics and Fitness had 8,076 unique visitors in July compared to 8,046 in June. Public Safety had 7,309 unique visitors in June compared to 7,337 in June. The Sports Park site had **109,606** unique visitors in July compared to 63,097 unique visitors in June. **96,249 of those visits were first time visitors.**
