Athletics

- Basketball All Star teams were selected for the 10U, 12U, 14U boys and 12U girls to participate in the SCAP District tournaments. Teams will compete at different venues the first weekend in March
- Spring sport registration began on January 30th and ended on February 24th. Sports offered are youth baseball, youth softball, youth soccer, senior softball and adult softball.
- To date:
 - 363 children are registered for baseball
 - 81 children are registered for softball
 - 193 children are registered for soccer

Sports Tourism

- Total Direct Economic Impact of events held in February = \$842,541 (54% increase from 2017)
