GIS

- Sarah provided maps for the Sports Complex trail signage contract.
- She attended a webinar on using GIS for mosquito control applications.
- Sarah Prepared Parks and Grounds desktop machine for Tree Maintenance.
- We continued working with ESRI training specialist to determine City's GIS Users training needs.
- Documented additional requested work and current workflow to support Parks and Grounds in maintaining City trees.

- We installed most of the new wireless access points. A few are yet to be deployed in Public Safety.
- We worked with water billing on an interactive voice response system for bill payment.
- We continued patching servers in June. We did not experience any more of the problems that were seen in May.
- We worked with finance on identifying Capital Projects done by the department and tracking the associated costs and labor.
- We adjusted security cameras at the Sports Park to better cover the newly installed ATM's.
- We installed new security cameras in the cash counting area for Beach Services.
- June was busy with end of fiscal year quotes.
- We expanded wireless coverage with a new access point in the old gym at J. Brian Floyd.

- Rob worked with Sarah Bishop, our new Database Administrator on identifying database installs and the applications that they support.
- As of July 2nd chair and umbrella season pass and rental sales reached \$164,565. This exceeds same period last year sales of \$132,725.
- Of note, on July 3rd through the 7th online rentals were disabled due to concerns that we could not fulfill such high rates of rental sales.
- According to "Stat Counter" NMB.US had 36,636 unique visitors in June versus 33,679 in May. PARKS.NMB.US had 23,137 unique visitors in June compared to 21,536 in May. Aquatics and Fitness had 8,046 unique visitors in June compared to 6,542 in May. Public Safety had 7,337 unique visitors in June compared to 5,797 in May. The Sports Park site had 63,097 unique visitors in June compared to 25,966 unique visitors in May. 55,508 of those visits were first time visitors.
