GIS

Technology

- With the jail closed for refurbishment, we have taken the opportunity to work with Mike McLamb and Kevin to remove defunct wiring and better organize the data closet next to communications. We are also removing old security cameras and replacing them with new wiring and high-resolution 4K cameras. These cameras will be much better suited in cases where prisoner or property treatment are questioned.
- Sarah Bishop researched SolarWinds monitoring of SQL servers. She also added servers to monitor SQL counters.
- Sarah also identified space and performance issues that she was able to clear up.
- We began or integration of ShoreTel with Active Directory. This will allow single sign on for our users.
- We assisted Planning and Development with a large import into Laserfiche.
- We are exploring the replacement of our Windows 7 virtual desktops with Windows 10. Currently we are doing compatibility evaluation.

- Online beach chair and umbrella rentals are showing a year over year increase. Last year as of May 15th online rentals stood at \$48,470 same date sale this year is \$67,220.
- According to “Stat Counter” NMB.US had 30,126 unique visitors in April versus 25,708 in March. PARKS.NMB.US had 13,806 unique visitors in April compared to 29,657 in March. Aquatics and Fitness had 5,834 unique visitors in April compared to 7,296 in March. Public Safety had 5,972 unique visitors in April compared to 4,553 in March.
