EVACUATION ORDER LIFTED

The Governor has lifted his evacuation order for Zone "A".

HURRICANE DEBRIS COLLECTION

If you are home and you want to get started on cleaning up debris on your property, you can do so. Place it curbside, not on the street, and not in any drainage swales or ditches. Do not bag yard waste and keep it separate from any structural debris. If you use a contractor, the contractor must take the debris with them. City personnel are out assessing damage and debris amounts throughout the City. When that is completed, we will announce a debris pickup schedule.

THE BEACH

All -in-all, the beach fared well. Beach accesses and walkovers appear to be in good shape, and the recently installed dunes fared well. City officials will be meeting with State and Federal officials next week to determine the extent of beach erosion and solutions.

LIFEGUARDS AND BEACH CHAIR.UMBRELLA RENTALS

Lifeguards will return to the beach Saturday morning, and rentals will also resume. When you return to the beach, be aware that hurricanes can churn up lots of stuff in the ocean and some of it may wind up in the surf. Be alert to where you step.

CITY PARKS

Parks and roads are in good shape. A few trees down but nothing serious and they are being removed. The Park at the North Myrtle Beach Park & Sports Complex is will open normal hours, however, the softball and soccer complex fields are closed for now because they are too wet for play. Events scheduled for the fields for this weekend will occur next weekend.

POWER OUTAGES

Some power outages remain in North Myrtle Beach and in other areas of the Grand Strand and Little River. Santee Cooper is working hard to resolve those issues, as they have throughout the storm.
