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TROPICAL STORM MICHAEL – October 8 10am Update

North Myrtle Beach, SC – October 8, 2018 – Yes, another one to begin to be aware of... This information comes from the National Weather Service Wilmington Office.

OVERVIEW:

On Sunday, Tropical Storm Michael was located east of the Yucatan Peninsula. It is expected to move north into the Gulf of Mexico today (Monday), and is expected to intensify into a hurricane on Tuesday.

It is projected that Michael will continue to move northward and make landfall along the coast of the southeast United States on Wednesday. As the storm reaches the Gulf Coast it is forecast to begin to go northeastward towards the Carolinas.

IMPACTS:

It is too early to determine the direct impacts as there remains considerable uncertainty of the track intensity, and timing. However, confidence that the area will see tropical storm force winds, heavy rain, and isolated tornadoes is increasing.

TIMING:

Michael is forecast to move into our area late Wednesday (October 10) into Thursday (October 11).
