Subject: Ordinance to Adopt Revised Flood Insurance Study and Flood Insurance Rate Maps	Division: Planning and Development

**Background and Proposal:**

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) maintains Flood Insurance Studies (FISs) and Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) showing the official boundaries of Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHAs), the Base Flood Elevations (BFEs), and the risk premium zones applicable to the City's flood insurance rates. These studies and maps are periodically updated to include better ground elevation data and reflect changes in ground elevations in the floodplain. The most recent past revision to the City's FIRMs occurred August 23, 1999. The FIS and FIRMs for the City of North Myrtle Beach have since been updated by FEMA and are to take effect on December 16, 2021. To remain compliant with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), the most recent revisions to FEMA's flood study and maps must be adopted within the required regulatory limits.

**ORDINANCE**

**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE REVISED FEMA FLOOD INSURANCE STUDY AND FLOOD INSURANCE RATE MAPS FOR THE CITY OF NORTH MYRTLE BEACH, SOUTH CAROLINA.**

**WHEREAS**, the South Carolina Legislature has delegated the responsibility to local governmental units to adopt regulations designed to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of its citizenry; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Federal Emergency Management Agency periodically updates the City's Flood Insurance Study and Flood Insurance Rate Maps to better reflect conditions in the floodplain, the most recent of which becomes effective on December 16, 2021; and,

**WHEREAS**, City Council desires to adopt the revised study and maps to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare and to minimize public and private losses due to flood conditions in specific areas.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH MYRTLE BEACH, SOUTH CAROLINA:**

**Section 1.** The revised Flood Insurance Study and Flood Insurance Rate Maps prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency for the City of North Myrtle Beach are hereby adopted.

**Section 2.** This ordinance shall become effective on December 16, 2021.
