


Proclamation

CONSTITUTION WEEK

WHEREAS, the Constitution was signed by representatives from the original colonies at the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia on September 17, 1787; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution, by its ratification by the 13 colonies who banded together to form a nation and make a written commitment to the protection of inalienable rights and individual liberty, was set forth in the Declaration of Independence; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution remains the only document based on Natural law and has served as a model for other governments around the world seeking freedom; and

WHEREAS, the tradition of celebrating the Constitution was started by the Daughters of the American Revolution; and


WHEREAS, in 1955, the Daughters of the American Revolution petitioned Congress to set aside September 17-23 annually to be dedicated for the observance of Constitution Week; and

WHEREAS, the resolution was later adopted by the United States Congress and signed into public law on August 2, 1956 by President Dwight D. Eisenhower; and


